General Scholarships

- * <u>Gilman Scholarship (All locations):</u> This program offers awards up to \$5,000 for study abroad, for U.S. citizen undergraduate students who are receiving federal Pell Grant funding. This is a national scholarship and is highly competitive.
- * NSEP, Boren Scholarship (Asia, South East Asia, Middle East, Africa): NSEP (National Security Education Program) was designed to provide Americans with the resources and encouragement they need to acquire skills and experiences in areas of the world critical to the future security of our nation, in exchange for a commitment to seek work in the federal government.
- * The DAAD (German Academic Exchange Service) Undergraduate Fellowships (Germany): The goal of this program is to support study abroad in Germany and at German universities. Highly qualified undergraduate students from the US and Canada who pursue study abroad in Germany are encouraged to apply.
- * The Bridging Scholarship (Japan): The Association of Teachers of Japanese Bridging Project offers scholarships to American students participating in study-abroad programs in Japan. Undergraduate students majoring in any field of study are eligible to apply for these scholarships. Japanese language study is not a prerequisite. Applicants must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents and be enrolled in a college or university in the United States.
- * National Association of Japan America Societies (Japan): A variety of other scholarships specific to Japan may be found at the web site.

Program Specific Scholarships:

* <u>Drexel in London Scholarship</u> The Study Abroad Office will award two \$500 need-based scholarships to Drexel students for WINTER term and two \$500 need-based scholarships for SPRING term. If you would like to apply, please provide the following with your application: Financial Aid Award summary for current academic year; and explanation of any special circumstances that may not be reflected on your Financial Aid summary. Scholarship recipients are required to write 2 articles for "Letters from Abroad" in the Triangle about your study abroad experiences in London and are required to attend 1 study abroad info session upon return to campus.

Scholarship deadlines: Winter term: Nov 1st Spring term: Dec 15th

* The UAS7/SIP (Study and Internship Program) Scholarship: sponsored by the DAAD (German Academic Exchange Service) is a 6- month scholarship that awards approximately €675 Euro/mo. for living expenses, including a monthly contribution to cover health and accident insurance. In addition, students receive €850 Euro as a contribution to travel expenses. Lastly, students are compensated by their employer a minimum of €500 Euro/month during their internship. With all of these financial resources, money should not prevent you from taking advantage of this fantastic opportunity! A selection committee composed of UAS7 academics and international education experts will select the SIP Scholarship grantees.
